



Expand Your Knowledge

The Human Connection: that's the vital theme of the 1982 Office Automation Conference, and it will encompass five program emphases. Each will be chaired by a recognized leader in the field, as will our series of Industry Workshops.



Individuals in the Automated Office. Chairman for this interest area is James H. Bair, of Bell Northern Research, a consultant of international reputation. He is co-author of The Office of the Future: Communication and Computers, and his research has developed a methodology for productivity measurement in the automated office and an implementation strategy for automated offices. Bair has also developed a comprehensive description of the impact of office automation on individuals as well as on organizations.

Organization and Management Concerns. Robert Johansen serves as chairman of this area. He came to the Institute of the Future, where he is now Senior Research Fellow, to help design and implement a project assessing the social effects of computerbased teleconferencing. As part of this work, Johansen organized an international workshop on the social evaluation of person-to-person telecommunications media. The results of the recent Intermedia Project, for which he was the principal investigator, have been published as Electronic Meetings: Technical Alternatives and Social Changes.



User Interface and Usability. Chairing this program area is Eric D. Carlson of the IBM Research Laboratory. His research has centered on improved hardware and software for inter-active applications. Currently, he is manager of a research department working on advanced office workstations and their applications in a distributed computing environment. Carlson's published writings have covered such subjects as computer graphics, software engineering, and decision support systems.





Communications and Systems Technology. Chairman Joseph Ehardt is contributing editor for Seybold Publications, a company known throughout the world for its in-depth evaluations of products. His articles evaluate word processing and office automation systems as well as publishing systems. Ehardt has given lectures and seminars on these subjects in the United States, Canada and England.

Integration Issues and Case Studies. The Information Systems Management Center for SRI International offers research and consulting services in diverse disciplines; and Alexia Martin, chairperson of OAC's fifth program area, serves the Center as a Management Systems Consultant. Martin has developed long-range plans for office support systems in industry and has assisted manufacturers in the development of market, sales, and support plans for their office systems products.


